Dear Parents/ Guardians,

As part of the national Junior Cycle reform students in second year will be required to complete Classroom Based Assessments in their subjects.

Classroom Based Assessments (CBAs) provide students with opportunities to demonstrate their learning and skills in ways not possible in a pen and paper examination, for example, their verbal communication and investigation skills. These assessments take place in class time and are assessed and graded by the subject teacher. To ensure equity and fairness, each subject department confers and discusses standards to expect for each grade. The result of the CBAs (one in second year and one in third year) will appear on your child's JCPA (Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement) which they will receive in autumn 2022. The grading system for CBAs is as follows: Exceptional, Above Expectations, In Line with Expectations, Yet to Meet Expectations.

When your child is in third year, they will complete a second CBA (CBA2). Based on this, they will complete an Assessment Task, which will be graded by the SEC (State Examinations Commission) and will form 10% of their overall grade in each subject. Therefore, to recap, results of CBAs appear on JCPA alongside written exam grades in all subjects, Other Areas of Learning (extra and co-curricular activities that your child took part in throughout their three years in Junior Cycle) and Wellbeing. They will also appear on school reports to be sent home at relevant times in second and third year.

I have included a CBA schedule for second years with this letter which outlines the timeframes in which each subject will undertake their CBA. **Therefore, attendance throughout these times is very important.** Of course, in the Covid-19 context, this is subject to change.
