It is the **Applicants** Responsibility to:

- Research thoroughly all the courses for which he/she is making application.
- ▶ Be 'au fait' with all aspects of the application system used (CAO) for these courses, i.e., procedures, dates, fees, rules, etc... (all in white pages of CAO Handbook)
- ► Fee €3,000 a year (Contribution Fee). Private colleges pay more
- ▶ 1 in 7 Stats
- Look at Modules in course- Engineering(maths) and Psychology (maths)...Music (bit of maths)
- ▶ Dropout after deadline €8,000

CAO - General Info.

- There are 3 types of courses students can apply for under the Nat. Qualifications Framework. Level 6,7,8.
- ► These are applied for on **2 separate lists** on a single form:
- ▶ ADVISE FILL UP BOTH LISTS, DO NOT IGNORE YOUR LEVEL 7 LIST!

Level 6 & 7 Courses

Ordinary Degrees (7) Higher Certificates (6)

Up to 10 Course Choices

Level 8 Courses

Honours Degrees (8)

Up to 10 Course Choices

- The courses are clearly labelled in the CAO Handbook
- ▶ N.B. Care must be taken with courses marked '*Restricted*'. (#- Careers Portal)
- These courses cannot be applied for after February 1st due to extra assessments required. (Interview/ Portfolio/ Exam/ Work Experience/ Performance).
- ▶ REMEMBER a level 8 is a level 8! So do not be bias to certain third levels!
- Tick boxes for data protection waiver- SUSI GRANT, EXEMTIONS LANGUAGES, DARE/ HEAR

QQI- Quality Qualifications Ireland-Levels of Courses



AWARDING BODIES

- Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI) makes awards in further and higher education and training
- SEC State Examinations Commission (Department of Education and Skills)
- Institutes of Technology
- Universities

AWARDS IN THE FRAMEWORK

There are four classes of award in the National Framework of Qualifications:



Major Awards: named in the outer rings, are the principal class of awards made at a level
Minor Awards: are for partial completion of the outcomes for a Major Award

Supplemental Awards: are for learning that is additional to a Major Award

Special Purpose Awards: are for relatively narrow or purpose-specific achievement.



Minimum ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

These must be satisfied before "Points" are considered

Minimum Entry Requirements E.g. UCD

Must Pass 6 subjects:

At least 2x H5's & 4x O6/H7

Often Pass in:

- ✓ Irish
- ✓ English
- ✓ Another Language*
- ✓ Mathematics*
- ✓ Science Subject*

Specific Subject Requirements

E.g.s

Engineering(UCD)

► H4 Maths

Veterinary Medicine(UCD)

► H5 Chemistry


French Law(UCD)

► H3 French (Since Last Year)

If all Entry Requirements are met → applicant is deemed 'Qualified' to apply.

Points So how do we calculate points....

- Points are calculated from <u>ONE</u> sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- Points total is calculated from **SIX** best subjects.
- ► Bonus points are awarded for Honours Mathematics. H1-H6 Grade Only. Be aware of pressure!
- Entry Requirements can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate. In most cases- Medicine different for example.



Making an application to Central Applications Office

- Applications can be made online or by paper form use one method only.
- Always keep proof of sending application: online print screen receipt, paper - obtain certificate of post.
- Form is very straight forward to fill out.
- Website: www.cao.ie

VERY IMPORTANT

Students must fill out both course lists in:

Genuine Order of Preference

- They should not put down courses on the basis of their predictions of next years cut off points. Points change from year to year, look at last year with predicted grades.
- Why? Look at how places are allocated.









Places Allocation

Note:

- The position of a course in a student's preference order does not in any way affect their chance of getting a place on that course. In other words- No Favouritism from college.
- ► The exact same procedure takes place for both lists on the form. Hence, students may get 2 offers in August - one from each list.
- You may accept only one course from either list as the one you wish to study.
- Students should think carefully about not accepting one of these offers, as they may not receive any further offers.
- Regardless of whether or not they accept a course in Round 1, they will still be offered a higher preference course in subsequent rounds if they become entitled one.

After Making Application

- Receive CAO number and Statement of Course Choices check this carefully.
- Some students may be called for extra assessments. (Majority April)
- Receive Statement of Application Record check details carefully (May). If not details are incorrect or not received contact CAO immediately.
- Change of Mind facility becomes available use sparingly and carefully (Fee €10-Feb, March, April. Free from May 5th to July 1st 5.15pm).
- Sit the Leaving Cert Exam (June)
- ► Leaving Cert. Results are sent to CAO. (August)
- Places are allocated and offered by post and online. (August)
- Students accept, reject or defer offered places. (August)
- Further rounds of offers are made until all course places are filled. (August)


- ► CAO Application Process Opens- 5th Nov at 12.00pm. Early discount fee €30. You can fill in your personal details and input provisional course choices early and then edit them before the 31st January for no extra charge. SET IT UP NOW!
- ► Early online Application Closing Date- 20th January 2021 at 5.15pm. Now price increases to €45.
- Closing date free on line Change of Mind- 1st February 5.15pm
- ▶ €10 to change courses from 5th Feb. Free from 5th May onwards.
- Normal Early Application Closing Date and Restricted Courses 1st February 2020
- ► Late Application Closing Date- 1st May 2020 5.15pm €60
- Statement of Application Record- End of May
- Change of Mind Closing Date- 1st July 2021 5.15.pm
- ► Leaving Cert Results- Mid August
- First Round of Offers will commence- Mid August





Other Options (PLC)

Post Leaving Certificate Courses

- Progression from Further to Higher operates in 2 main ways;
 - ▶ (1) HELS- Higher Education Links Scheme links specific courses to reserved higher education places, e.g. Nursing, childcare, engineering
 - ▶ (2) Pilot Some IT's and HEIs award PLC points up to a max of 390 on an open competition basis. 'Distinctions to Points'
- Research preferred course, check colleges for links/reserved places and then decide on which PLC suits you.



Apprenticeships

- Earn as you learn
- Find an employer to train you as an apprenticeship
- On the job (work Placement) and off the job theory (college/centre)
- ▶ 50% in each setting
- Learn on the job essential skills and be 'moulded'
- ► Can lead to a level 5-10 on National Framework Qualifications
- Usual 2-4 years in duration
- Formal contract between employer and centre
- Salary usually increases with service
- Growing constantly currently 36 available- construction, electrical, engineering, finance (new), motor
- Check careers portal/ apprenticeships.ie / rstc.ie Dundalk.
- ESB- Careers Services (Prep) and esb.ie/careers

- ► Eligibility: Based on parental income, number of dependent children, nationality, course choice etc.
- Multi-step process:


Registration, application, supporting documentation, confirmation of course choice

- Application Usually Opens First Week April
- Application Closes TBC (Check last date deadlines online).





Route is an admissions route for school leavers who for social, financial or cultural reasons are under-represented at third level education.





Disability Access Route to Education

► DARE is a 3rd level admissions scheme for school leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on their 2nd level education.

List of the types of disabilities and documented requirements that DARE considers on Handout on website. Link given n guidance newsletter on School App.



What is DARE?



DARE offers reduced points places to school leavers who as a result of having a disability have experienced additional educational challenges in second level education.

You Should Apply if You Have any of the Following Disabilities

- Autistic Spectrum Disorders (including Asperger's)
- ADD / ADHD
- Blind / Vision Impaired
- Deaf / Hard of Hearing
- DCD Dyspraxia/Dysgraphia
- Mental Health Conditions
- Neurological Conditions
 - Brain Injury, Epilepsy,
 - Speech & Language Communication Disorder
- Significant Ongoing Illness
- Physical Disability
- Specific Learning Difficulty (Dyslexia & Dyscalculia)

Benefits of making a DARE Application:

- ► If you apply and are considered eligible you may be offered a place for your preferred course even if you don't have the required points.
- ► Additional help at University/College- exams, extra tuition, accommodation, travel, etc.

Exemptions- Tips- PAGE 9 CAO HANDBOOK



- If you wish exemption from Irish or modern language contact admission office of College/ University for details.
- Exempt with report from primary/ secondary school.
- ▶ Born in north with birth cert- can use Irish as Third Language. Still need to send in forms.
- Indicate on your online CAO application form that you are applying for exemption. Tick box.
- Watch your dates/ deadlines.
- Check your Statement of Application Record in May. Inform CAO immediately if there are any error or omission.
- Send in correct documentations and forms to Universities/ Colleges to prove exemption. Usual can download from online. Copies on desk for NUI Form (welcome to collect end of talk)
