TY is a one year school-based programme between Junior and Senior Cycle.

It is designed to act as a bridge between the two by providing a smooth transition from the more dependent learning of the Junior Cycle to the more independent learning required for the Senior Cycle.

- Learning-led as opposed to exam-driven
- School based unique to each school
- Student-focused: skills-based project work





- (i) the student's school record over the past three years, (ii) the information supplied on the application form and (iii) information sought at the interview stage.
- Criteria for acceptance into TY is clearly defined and forms part of the school's Admission policy.
